School Absence-Important Procedures

Please could all parent/carers ensure <u>they let the office know every day</u> that their child is unwell and the nature of the illness. Medical evidence may be required for absences longer than 5 days and when attendance falls below 90%.

Please also provide written proof of any appointments and advise whether your child will be requiring a school meal.

May we also remind you that if your child has vomiting and/or diarrhoea, you must wait 48 hours from the last episode before bringing your child back to school.

Coo<u>l Milk</u>

There are a number of children who are refusing milk at break time. If your child is 5 years or older and you are paying for their milk, please have a conversation with your child to see whether they still require milk? If you wish to cancel your subscription you will need to contact coolmilk.com



Please note that the cut off time each week is a Tuesday, for the following week.

Our milk supplier has recently changed the packaging of the milk from cartons to plastic bottles which are not as popular with our children. We have contacted the supplier to see whether the cartons could be brought back but unfortunately they have advised us that the bottles are here to stay and they are not able to change to cartons!

Children Scooters!

Please can we remind all parents with children on scooters/bikes that they are mindful of pedestrians when cycling between the two school. We have received a complaint from a local neighbour where children are too far ahead of parents.



Medical Room-Important

Please note, as the medical room is going 'paperless' we will no longer be sending notes home with children regarding 'bumped head/face/eye. Any injuries will be recorded in Arbor and you will receive an 'in app message' via your Arbor account. Obviously, if your child has a more serious accident we will of course call you.

Staff Car Park

This is a polite reminder that only staff members can park in the staff car park at any time unless you have received permission from the school office.

We understand that there are exceptional circumstance in which family members may need to use our car park but this must be approved by the school in advance. If you are running late or there is no parking available outside the school you are **not permitted** to use the staff car park as an overflow space. We have had a few incidents of staff being blocked in and unable to leave the premises, kitchen delivery drivers blocked in or unable to make their food deliveries and one case of a staff member's car being damaged. We would like to remind all parents and carers **not to park in the staff car park** unless you have permission.




