Dear Parents, Carers and Families,

It has been another busy and exciting week at Carlisle Infant School.

Last week, our school community came together to support Comic Relief 2026, with children and staff wearing a red accessory and raising **£64** for this important charity!

Our Year 2 pupils returned last Friday from a memorable visit to the Tower of London. They have been producing detailed and descriptive recounts of their experience throughout this week - this enriching visit clearly had a great impact on their learning.

In the classroom, our pupils continue to engage in purposeful and creative activities. Year 1 have been designing and making Dino Buggy's, exploring how fixed and freely-rotating axles enable their vehicles to move smoothly and at the fastest speeds. Year 2 have loved designing and making their castles with moving parts. I was particularly impressed by one child's model which he told me was of an underwater castle, designed in the shape of a hammerhead shark.

There is a large amount of lost property currently at the front of school. I will aim to display it at the front gate today and tomorrow for you to come along and collect. If you have any spare children's hangers you could donate, we would greatly appreciate them so we can display fleeces and jumpers more easily.

Finally, I am pleased to report a great improvement in the punctuality of our pupils since our communication with individual families. We will continue to remind those who are arriving later than they should, but we are genuinely delighted to see this positive progress.

I hope you all enjoy the two-week break ahead, and that the sunshine continues.

Child Pick Up Arrangements from Afterschool Clubs-Important

If your child is attending an afterschool club and is going home with someone else, please can you let the club know directly via email and copy in the school office email on

info@carlisle.richmond.sch.uk **Please can all parents ensure they are collecting their children on time from afterschool clubs. All clubs finish at 3.15pm with the exception of baking club which finishes at 4.30pm. Thank you.**

Vomiting/Diarrhoea/Temperature

Reminder-Please remember if your child has had **vomiting and/or diarrhoea** then your child must remain off school for **48 hours**, from either the last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea. Due to updated advice from Public Health England, regarding high temperatures, if your child is well and no longer has a high temperature (without needing Calpol/ibuprofen medication), they are welcome to return to school.

Confusion Regarding Term Dates!

Please remember the children will return to school on Monday 13th April 2026.

There was an issue reported where incorrect term dates were showing. It was an internal document that was on our server and somehow a Google search for the term dates was linking to this copy rather than the most recent copy. The website has always had the correct dates as a click through but for some reason if you searched for “Carlisle infants term dates” via Google it was going straight to this internal document rather than the document we had published. It took us quite a while to figure out what was going on but our website designers have now removed the incorrect copy from the server.

Please remember that all children under the age of 5 will receive free Government funded milk. **When your child turns 5, or if they are already over the age of 5, you have the option to pay for their milk directly through Cool Milk.**

If you would like your child to receive milk, then please visit www.coolmilk.com and select “register your child for milk here” then follow the on-screen instructions to register and pay.

Please be aware the cut off date is Tuesday for milk orders to commence the following week. All parent/carers must contact cool milk if they have any problems.

Understanding Autism



Welcome to the **SEND Segment**. Here we will share key information on different areas of SEN need for primary-aged children. As we approach Autism Awareness Month in April, we wanted to share some information with you about autism to help our whole school community better understand and support autistic children and young people. Thank you and we hope you enjoy this week's newsletter. The Federation SEND Team 😊

What is Autism?

Autism, or Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), is a lifelong developmental condition that affects how a person communicates with and relates to other people, and how they experience the world around them.

It's called a 'spectrum' condition because it affects people in different ways and to varying degrees. No two autistic people are the same.

Key Characteristics

Autistic people may experience differences in:

Communication and social interaction

- Understanding and using verbal and non-verbal communication
- Understanding social cues and body language
- Making and maintaining friendships
- Understanding other people's emotions and expressing their own

Patterns of behaviour and interests

- Preferring familiar routines and finding changes difficult
- Having intense or highly focused interests
- Experiencing sensory sensitivities (such as to light, sound, touch, taste or smell)
- Repeating certain behaviours or having particular routines

Important things to know

Autism is not caused by: Parenting style, Vaccines or Diet

Every autistic person is unique

Some autistic people may need little or no support, while others may need help with daily activities

Many autistic people have strengths in areas such as attention to detail, pattern recognition, or creative thinking

Support for Families in Richmond upon Thames

SENDIASS - SENDIASS offers information, advice and support for parents and carers of children and young people with SEND. All local authorities have such a service.

National Autistic Society - Comprehensive information about autism. Helpline and online support. Local groups and activities.

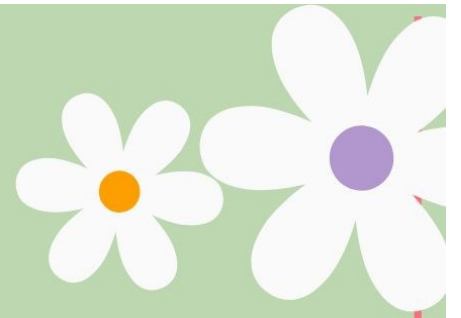

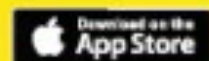

Breakfast Club

Children attending Breakfast club should arrive and be seated by 8.10 for Breakfast to be served.

If you would like your child to attend any of our wraparound settings please pre-book the sessions on the Arbor portal in advance of the 3pm cut off period the day before the required session.

Simply Log into your Arbor account / Click on Orange Tab 'Quick Actions' / Click 'Clubs' / Scroll to section (Your Child Name) can be registered for these clubs (Academic Year 2025/2026) / Click which club, ie Breakfast, Treehouse or The Hub / Click green tab-'Register for this club'/ Follow prompts, ie club/next/time/days etc

We accept childcare vouchers from a wide range of providers. If you will be paying via childcare vouchers, please send us an email with the reference number and provider for your child. Children will be expected to be collected by 6.00pm prompt. Any parent arriving after 6.00pm (for whatever reason) will be charged a flat £10 fee, and £5 for every 15 mins, or part of. Places will be allocated on a first come first served basis – the system will tell you if there are no places available.

Please note that on the last day of each term when school finishes at 1.30pm/1.45pm the costs for afterschool per child rise to £26.10 in order to allow for the extended hours of the session.
