11.45 – 1.00: Lunchtime

Pupil Premium Grant

The **pupil premium grant** is funding to improve educational outcomes for pupils in state-funded schools in England.

The following groups are eligible for pupil premium:

- pupils who are recorded as eligible for free school meals, or have been recorded as eligible in the past 6 years, including eligible children of families who have no recourse to public funds (NRPF)
- children looked after by local authorities, referred to as looked-after children
- children previously looked after by a local authority or other state care, referred to as previously looked-after children

Pupil Premium Grant

This helps by...

- providing essential funds to ensure we can **employ Teaching Assistants** to support learning within school
- providing funding to pay for a wide range of **practical resources** to aid learning within school
- supporting families where needed to afford to offer **enriching opportunities** for your children to participate in
- ensure all children are ‘**school ready**’ and have the **same opportunities as their peers**
