Growing Frogs




This week we have been learning the difference between fiction and non-fiction books. Our book of the week is actually a bit of both! Growing Frogs is fiction story about a little girl who learns all about the life cycle of a frog; looking after frogspawn as it changes into tadpoles, then froglets until finally fully grown adult frogs. The book has lots of tips and advice of how to do this. Did you know you should always use pond water if keeping frogspawn and tadpoles? Can your child remember any other tips?

Maths:

In maths we have been looking at numbers beyond 10 and the pattern of numbers up to 20. We have noticed that the numbers above ten are made up of ten and some more for example, 16 is ten and six more. We have been doing lots of counting, singing and reading number stories as well as using a variety of resources to explore numbers. At home, or out and about, can your child find ways to count beyond 10? How many stairs can they climb? How many ducks can they spot in the park? Can your child build a tower of more than ten?
