### Book of the Week:




### Commotion in the Ocean by Giles Andreae

Our book for this week and next is a fun collection of poems about a variety of creatures that live in or near the ocean. From the coast to the bottom of the sea, we met turtles, sharks, octopus, whale and fish. We have enjoyed spotting the rhyming words in the poems and have had lots of discussion about out favourite creatures. This

week we have learnt all about sharks. What is your child's favourite creature from the ocean? Can they tell you anything about them? Next week, we will focus on whales and dolphins!



We have once again been looking at shape, and learning about what it means to rotate them (i.e. move round a centre point). We have explored moving, turning, rotating and flipping shapes to fit into the spaces provided. We have discovered that we can make new shapes by combining others. We have also learnt that the opposite is true and we can separate or split shapes to make new ones! We have enjoyed playing with shapes, solving shape puzzles and making our own pictures from shapes too.
