## Phonics Focus

Hello everyone and Happy Friday! This week we have been learning 4 new phonemes (sounds) in our phonics sessions. We have started oral blending words and even had a go at reading them. When we are oral blending we sound out each phoneme in the word and then see if your child can hear the word that we are trying to sound out e.g. put your hand on your ch-i-n, or can you p-a-t your head? Perhaps you could play some oral blending games at home.



We say `g g g' *`Round the goat's face and curl under his chin.'* 



We say 'o o o'

'All around the octopus'



We say `c c c'

We say `k k k'

'Curl around the cat'

Can your child think of any words that start with these phonemes? E.g. `g g gorilla' or `o o octopus'



'Down the kite, up to the top corner and down to the corner.'
